

The feast on the highest floor put an end to our visit, but the hospitality and enthusiasm of professors and staff at Showa University Hospital will extend to us.


5. Showa University



The next stop was Showa University




Thanks to the support of professors and some seniors, the first-year students could practice to use remote control to operate the ARC therapy machine.


